VOTER ID – WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Beginning with elections that occur after September 17, 2012, all voters MUST provide a current photo ID at each election in order to vote. If you cannot provide acceptable proof of identification, you may cast a provisional ballot and verify your identity with the county elections board within six days following the election.

If you cannot locate your Social Security card or birth certificate, Tim Briggs and his staff will gladly help you fill out the paperwork to obtain these items. Brochures will also be available at the Center.


