KEEPING SENIORS INFORMED

GET MOVING IN THE MORNING

When you wake up, take a few moments to anticipate getting out of bed. Take a few deep breaths. Open and close you hands. Spread your fingers. Move your legs to get your circulation moving. Slowly stretch all over. Sit up on the side of the bed.

Sit there for a little bit to restore your equilibrium. During this time think about your day's activities and mentally prepare for them. Consider how you will fit your activity and exercise into your day. Will you take a walk, go to the gym or attend an exercise class? Think about activities that will encourage movement.

You will recall that for every hour of sitting you should have at least two (2) minutes of movement. Go to the kitchen for a glass of water. Check on your house plants. Tidy up a shelf on your book case. Take the trash out. Check your mailbox. Walk around while you make a social phone call. Take the dishes out of the dishwasher. Change the towels in the bathroom. Do any little two minute activity you can think of to do. You body will thank you!

SAFETY TIPS FOR SENIORS FOR AT HOME AND OUT AND ABOUT

(info from the website of the PA Attorney General)

Pennsylvania has one of the highest senior populations in the country and our seniors are more active than ever. It is important that they are prepared when out socially, traveling or simply enjoying their home life.

BE SECURE

- Close and lock windows when you leave the house, keep your doors locked at all times, even while you are at home.
- Don't let strangers into your home. Ask all delivery people and utility workers for ID.
- Never deal with a contractor who shows up unsolicited or with "left over materials."
- Always use a contractor that is registered with the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General.

- When you are gone for more than a day, make sure your home appears occupied — use automatic timers to turn on lights and a radio or television.
- Always place a hold request on mail and newspapers while away and also park a second vehicle in the driveway.
- Do not hide your keys under the mat or in other conspicuous places.
- Many of our older citizens have worked for years to build their retirement funds and establish good credit, making them common targets for scammers, con artists and thieves.

NEVER

- Never give your personal information to anyone who contacts you and asks for it; only when you initiate the contact.
- Never send money, wire transfers or pre-paid cash cards to someone you do not know.

REMEMBER

- Banks, credit card companies and government offices never call you to verify your personal or account information.
- Law enforcement agencies will not contact you and demand that you make a payment of fines over the phone or internet.
- No one can win a lottery from a country they've never visited or a sweepstakes they didn't enter. "You have to play to win."
- No offer to share millions of dollars, recover wealth, or provide large sums of money for you to distribute to charity will require you to provide "front money."
- If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.
