COMMUNITY HAPPENINGS FRIENDS OF VALLEY FORGE PARK SPEAKER SERIES

As part of the Friends mission to provide interesting and compelling programming for the public, the annual Speaker Series is held in cooperation with the Washington Memorial Chapel. Each year, a new slate of programs is scheduled and offered at the Chapel or the park theater. Programs are held on the first Tuesday of the month at 7 pm. The following programs will be held at the Chapel.

Tuesday, January 8: *African Americans at the Valley Forge Encampment presented by Joe Becton* teacher, historian, interpreter. As many as one thousand Africans served at the 1777-78 Valley Forge encampment with the Continental Army, under all kinds of conditions. Some, such as William Lee and Hannah Till, were enslaved. Others, such as Cyrus Bustill (a baker), were family members of soldiers or were employed at camp. Many Africans—Jack Sisson, Peter Salem and Salem Poor, for example—were heroes.

Tuesday, February 5: Native Americans in the American Revolution presented by Daniel K.
Richter, historian, educator, author. Discover why most Native Americans allied themselves with the British against the United States during the American Revolution – and what it cost them.

Tuesday, March 5: Abigail Adams: Founding Mother, Patriot, Wife and Political Advisor presented by Kim Hanley, re-enactor, historian, motivational speaker. Kim shares her first-person interpretation on a conversation with "Dear Abigail," an astute wife and mother, guaranteed to provide insight into the concerns of 18th century Americans, as well as those of the 21st century.
