Pyfer, M.D. board certified in ophthalmic surgery by the American Board of Ophthalmology and a Fellow of the American Academy of Ophthalmology. He specializes in stateof-the-art refractive and cataract surgery. FRIENDS OF VALLEY FORGE PARK SPEAKER SERIES

As part of the Friends mission to provide interesting and compelling programming for the public, the annual Speaker Series is held in cooperation with the Washington Memorial Chapel. Each year, a new slate of programs is scheduled and offered at the Chapel or the park theater. Programs are held on the first Tuesday of the month at 7 pm. The following programs will be held at the Chapel:

JANUARY 7: THE STORY OF CLIVEDEN: BUILDING A MEMORY. Presenter David Young, the executive director of Cliveden. "Cliveden" is synonymous with the October 4, 1777 Battle of Germantown. Benjamin Chew (1722-1810), who at one time held the position of Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Province of Pennsylvania, purchased the bucolic Germantown property in the Philadelphia countryside as a summer retreat for his family. The house he named "Cliveden" was constructed there between 1763 to 1767. Except for a brief period between 1779 and 1797, the Chews occupied Cliveden for seven generations until 1972. Cliveden is a National Historic Landmark and one of America's great historic sites.

February 4: THE HISTORICAL EVOLUTION OF

VALLEY FORGE. Speaker Marc Brier, a ranger at Valley Forge National Historical Park, discusses the many and varied visions of this iconic American treasure.

March 4: AN EVENING WITH MARTHA WASHINGTON: GENERAL'S WIFE AND

PRESIDENT'S LADY. Historic interpreter Carol Spacht presents a fascinating first-person look at a first lady.
