MONDAY, NOVEMBER 3 FLU SHOTS* From 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM: Administered by Rite Aid Pharmacy. No appointment necessary. If you are interested you can call Rite Aid at 610-293-1496 with your insurance information to verify coverage. (Calling Rite Aid does not obligate you.) Medicare does pay for flu vaccines. The trained and licensed Rite Aid pharmacists will administer the vaccine. After the shot is received, you are requested to wait for about 15 minutes before leaving the building.

*The shots were originally to be administered by Main Line Health; however, they were notified by the manufacturer that the shipment of their supply of seasonal flu vaccine was delayed and they have not been given a definitive answer as to when they can expect the shipment. If you have already registered with Main Line Health you can still come in and Rite Aid will administer the shot.

KEEPING SENIORS INFORMED NEED SOME REASONS TO BE MORE ACTIVE?

During continuous exercise, your brain releases endorphins, chemicals that block pain messages from reaching your brain cells. Endorphins are also responsible for the feelings of satisfaction and pleasure you get from a good workout. People who exercise

regularly are likely to be more self-confident and focused and have reduced stress levels. Simple stretching exercises, for example, can relax tense muscles and help you sleep better. If you are upset or distressed, physical activity can help improve your mood. In fact, many health professionals consider physical activity part of treatment for depression. SENIOR HEALTH: STEPS YOU CAN TAKE TO PREVENT FALLING AND IMPROVE YOUR HEALTH AND WELL BEING

If you're like me, you're concerned about falling and the possibility of breaking a hip, wrist, or rotator cuff especially with the approach of winter and icy walks and driveways. I have two friends who suffered breaks last winter.

Let me tell you what I discovered that might help prevent this from happening. We fall, of course, because we lose balance. Did you know that you can learn counter-balancing moves that will prevent you from falling? We also lose balance because our center of gravity may be out of alignment due to incorrect posture. As we age we begin to lean forward with both our body and neck without even realizing it.

In the Tai Chi/Chi Kung class with Marc Shay every Wednesday from 12-12:45 I'm learning counter balancing methods so that when I feel like I'm going to fall, I can quickly correct myself. I'm also learning center of gravity posture alignment techniques which train me to stand correctly because if I'm leaning forward it's more likely that I'll fall. Acquiring these new skills has made me a lot less worried about falling.

This class is about balance in another way too. Yes, it's about keeping your joints flexible, your muscles toned and internal organs invigorated in non-strenuous, relaxing, graceful ways. But Tai Chi and Chi Kung also combines breathing, movement and standing meditation that unblocks, aligns, and purifies the body's energy, benefiting your overall health through stress reduction and exercise. It helps you to be tranquil and centered.

So here is a great way to improve your health and wellbeing and it only costs three dollars a week. One free class in November to new tai chi attendees. (Contributed by Claire Borchardt)
