KEEPING SENIORS INFORMED MAINTAINING FLEXIBLE, FUNCTONAL HANDS

Have you ever thought about how important it is to have flexible, functional hands? We are constantly using our hands from the time we turn off the alarm in the morning until we turn out the light at bedtime.

If your fingers are stiff it will affect your dexterity and hand strength. Unless you are affected by serious

arthritic problems (then you need to consult your doctor) there are some things that could possibly assist in maintaining your hand flexibility and function.

In the morning if your hands feel really stiff, warming them before doing some exercises may ease the stiffness. Put some warm water in the sink to bathe them for a few minutes or clasp them around your cup of hot coffee or tea to make hand movements more comfortable.

Some finger/hand exercises include: separating and closing the fingers several times, touching the thumb to each finger several times, bending the fingers over to the heel of the hand, bending the fingers over to the palm of the hand and rotating the thumb in a circle in both directions.

It is important to do these exercises first thing in the morning when hands have been immobile all night. You will gain additional benefits if you repeat them another time during the day and before you go to sleep. *(Contributed by Jane Burger)*

INHERITED IRAS ARE NOT PROTECTED FROM CREDITORS IN BANKRUPTCY CASE

The US Supreme Court recently ruled that creditors can go after assets in inherited IRAs because the accounts are not treated the same as regular IRAs, which are regarded as retirement assets. Examples of differences: Unlike original owners, heirs cannot add money to the IRAs and can take money out of them anytime without penalty. The decision is especially important for spouses. A spouse who inherits has the option to roll the assets into his/her own IRA - subject to a 10% early-withdrawal penalty if he takes money from his own IRA before age 59-1/2. If the spouse does not rollover, the account is considered an inherited IRA and is not protected in bankruptcy. This makes the rollover a better choice for many people but every situation is different, so consult a knowledgeable financial adviser. (from "yourmoney" forbes.com)


