KEEPING SENIORS INFORMED

IT'S ALL IN THE TERMINOLOGY

Does the word "exercise" make you shake your head and/or shudder? Perhaps it's time to utilize the word "activity" instead of exercise. For older individuals the thought of going to a gym to "work out" is not always appealing. It sounds like a lot of work.

However, if you focus your thoughts on the word activity, you know this is something most people can do. Think of all the ways you can increase your activity level. Choose a parking spot farther away from the door of the store to have some extra steps. Go up and down several aisles in the store while shopping.

If able, use the stairs instead of the elevator. At home use the stairs as often as you can. Stand while talking on the phone. Assess your sitting time. At least once an hour it is advisable to get up and move around for three to five minutes. This keeps your circulation moving and challenges your muscles to move.

Consider getting a pedometer to track your steps. If you have one, put it on as soon as you get up and wear it until bedtime. Aim for 10,000 steps. This is about five miles.

Think about physical movement as a way to oxygenate all of your body cells and keep yourself both healthier and more independent. **MOVE!!** (Contributed by Jane Burger)
